Mr. Daniel J. Hartmann has been the Deputy Director of Army Foreign Liaison, since June 19, 2000. He is responsible for overseeing relations between Headquarters, Department of the Army and the Washington Corps of Military Attachés, distinguished foreign visits to senior Army leaders, and foreign protocol support to the headquarters.

Mr. Hartmann grew up in Ridgefield Park, New Jersey. He earned a Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from Rider College in Trenton, New Jersey, and a Master's Degree in Russian Area Studies from Georgetown University. He is a graduate of the Armor Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Foreign Area Officer Course, the Defense Language Institute Basic Russian Course, the U.S. Army Russian Institute, the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, the U.S. Army War College Defense Strategy Course, the Joint Military Attaché Course, the Joint Intelligence Course, and the MIT Seminar XII program.

Immediately prior to assuming his current position, he worked as a civilian contractor in the Regional Integration and Assessment Directorate of the Office of the Deputy Under Secretary of the Army (International Affairs), providing regional expertise and assistance to the U.S. Army desk officers for the States of the former Soviet Union, China, Taiwan, and Mongolia. He also managed the Army Executive Agency of the Harvard Executive Programs for General Officers from Ukraine and Russia.

Mr. Hartmann retired from the United States Army at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in 1996 after 22 years of service. Commissioned in 1974 in the Regular Army as a Second Lieutenant of Armor, he served at various locations in the United States, Germany, and Russia. While assigned to the Second and Third Armored Cavalry Regiments, he has been an Armored Cavalry Platoon Leader, Troop Executive Officer, Troop Commander, and Headquarters and Headquarters Troop Commander. He has also been an Armor Battalion Executive Officer.

As a Foreign Area Officer specializing in the countries of the former Soviet Union, he served on the staffs of the Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Central Command, and Commander-in-Chief, U.S. European Command. In 1992, he was the Director for Plans and Policy for Combined Task Force Provide Comfort, a multinational coalition conducting defensive operations to enforce the security zone and northern no-fly zone in Iraq. From 1994 to 1996, he was the Assistant Army Attaché in Moscow, Russia and, concurrently, was the Military Attaché to Uzbekistan until 1995.
