

SPP – Partnerships Historical Context



State Partnership Framework

(Mil-Mil)



- Authority Legislative language allows "Whole of Govt" engagement
- Funding specific authority to utilize NG appropriations for SPP engagements
- Examples
 - Increased FAM participation by partner countries
 - Allows NG to engage with security forces and disaster and humanitarian relief agencies not housed in or part of MOD
 - Bangladesh shares its vast peacekeeping expertise with

(Interagency)



- Authority Legislative language allows "Whole of Govt" engagement
- Funding specific authority to utilize NG appropriations for SPP engagements to include foreigners and non DOD civilians where activity relevant
- Examples
 - USCG -SPP Partnership
 - DTRA Info/Engagement sharing

(Corollary)



- Authority MOA/MOU
- Funding Other sources
- Examples
 - WI Citizen Diplomacy Initiative to be based on SPP model
 - Increased NG collaboration with Sister Cities International
 - Allows NG to facilitate introductions and activities from private experience/membership
 - Chamber of Commerce
 - World Affairs Council
 - Rotary International
 - Scouting





"Maintain properly trained and equipped units available for prompt mobilization for war, national emergency or as otherwise needed


